I am filled with such joy and gratitude to write the following words: **welcome back to *The 5 & Dime***. This revival will never erase the pain, grief, or fear that we've all experienced over the last 15+ months; we send love and comfort to those who've been affected in any way—big or small—throughout this pandemic.
